

SPOTLIGHT

on Mabel Vivian Broome

In honor of African American History in the Month of February we celebrate Mabel Vivian Broome who, after an intense six months of training, became the first American Officer of African descent in The Salvation Army's Central Territory on July 20th 1915.



Officers during that time in America, especially in what was called "Chicago #2 Slum," where Mabel served, faced open hostility and an extremely demanding workload, caring for new mothers and their babies, ministering to the sick and shut-ins, mending clothes, soliciting donations for food and shelter. More responsibility included church programs-nightly services, frequent open-air evangelistic meetings, braving brothels and saloons, sharing the Gospel and selling TSA's national magazine The War Cry. She resigned because of delicate health but soon returned to work and accepted a reassignment to TSA's USA Eastern Territory, where she served at the Boston Rescue Home until her early death in 1930. Here's to Mabel Vivian Broome, a woman of mighty valor.
